How Much Internet Speed Do You Need?

If your online activities have expanded or you've recently purchased a new computer, it may be time to reevaluate whether your current Internet connection still meets your needs. Since speed is a key factor, we'll begin by defining some measurement terminology:

Download Speed – rate at which data travels from the Internet to your computer **Upload Speed** – rate at which data travels from your computer to the Internet

Kbps – kilobits per second (or thousands of bits per second)

Mbps – megabits per second (or millions of bits per second)

You'll run across these terms frequently when you read about various types of Internet connections. For example, a basic dial-up connection may offer a connection speed of 56 Kbps while high speed Internet access (such as DSL) may offer a download speed of 3 Mbps and an upload speed of 1 Mbps.

A dial-up connection requires the use of a modem and a phone line to dial into an Internet Service Provider's (ISP) node, in order to get access to the Internet. The data transmission rate is rather slow, usually 56 Kbps or less. Because of this, it will take a long time to download large files. Another disadvantage is that your phone line is occupied whenever you're online, which can result in frustrating busy signals for your callers. Dial-up was very popular in the past but is now steadily being replaced by high speed Internet access.

High speed Internet access provides the convenience of an always-on connection—there are no phone numbers to dial and no waiting to get online. It also offers much higher connection speeds of up to 15 Mbps. With high speed Internet access, you can quickly download movies, music, and software; easily watch streaming video of breaking news; and instantly move from website to website. You can also make and receive phone calls while you're working online. Many people find that once they switch to high speed Internet access, they wonder how they ever got along without it.
